At Berry Creek Community School, students benefit from a blended focus on both agriculture and horticulture, gaining practical experience that connects directly to career pathways and post-secondary opportunities.

Across the division, our schools are also building strong programming in the skilled trades. JC Charyk, Consort, and Morrin Schools are offering expanded trades and technology courses, including construction, welding, mechanics, and fabrication, giving students early exposure to high-demand skills in supportive, hands-on environments.

Together, these programs demonstrate Prairie Land's commitment to relevant, future-focused education that prepares rural students for success, whether they choose to pursue post-secondary studies, apprenticeships, or go directly into the workforce.
